Defensive driving offered districtwide

Several National Safety Council Defensive Driving courses (DDC-4) will be offered throughout the Illinois Eastern Community Colleges District during March.

Classes will be offered from 6 to 10 p.m. March 11 at Wabash Valley College Science Building Room 55; March 13, Frontier Community College Foundation Hall; March 19,

Olney Central College Wattleworth Hall Room 114; and March 21, Lincoln Trail College Harry L. Crisp Educational Center Room 106.

The DDC-4 course is a classroom "face-to-face" course. It is accepted as an assigned driving course as required for traffic-related court supervision. Some insurance companies will provide a discount for successful com-

pleters of this course. Participants successfully completing the one-night course will receive a National Safety Council, DDC-4 Certificate. The cost for this class is \$50. Special rates are available to senior citizens wishing a refresher on safe driving skills.

Basic Dog Obedience, for animals 6 months old and older, will meet from 6 to 8 p.m. Tuesdays March 12 through April 16 in the Industrial Annex. Lifeguard certification offered at LTC

Earn American Red Cross lifeguard certification in six days this spring at LTC.

The initial meeting and swim test for lifeguard training and certification will be from 7 to 9 p.m. March 13 in the LTC pool. Additional class times are: 5 to 8 p.m. March 15, 6 to 9 p.m. March 16, 5 to 9 p.m. March 22, 6 to 9 p.m. March 23 and 1 to 2 p.m. March 24.

Participants must be at least 15 years old or celebrate their 15th birthday by the end of the class. Students must be present for all class meetings to obtain certification. An instructor-recommended textbook will be required.

The first day of class, participants will take a swim test consisting of a 300-yard swim, an eight-foot deep dive to retrieve a 10-pound brick, and a two-minute treading water test.

Class participants will learn Red Cross lifeguard duties and responsibilities and how to carry them out in

compliance with Red Cross Lifeguard training program requirements. Students will also receive training and certification in American Red Cross first aid and CPR for the professional rescuer.
