FCC Seeking Student Ambassadors for 2017-18

Frontier Community College (FCC) in Fairfield is looking for outstanding individuals to act as student ambassadors for the 2017-2018 academic year. Student ambassadors are responsible for promoting unity and engagement among the FCC student body; recruiting prospective students; and promoting district- and campus-wide events, activities, and programs.

Student ambassadors should demonstrate a desire to represent Frontier Community College and exhibit strong communication and interpersonal skills. The requirements to apply are: must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours at FCC during the fall and spring semesters, must have completed the FAFSA, maintain a 3.0 grade point average, be willing to attend all FCC events and activities, and willing to be subjected to a background check and/or drug screening.

In exchange for their time, students will receive 12 hours of tuition and a \$200 book scholarship for two semesters. Student ambassadors will serve one year, and be required to work a minimum of 225 hours throughout the semester.




