Students Honored at GED Graduation Ceremony

Twenty-nine students were recognized at Frontier Community College's GED Graduation Ceremony on Tuesday, June 26. A large crowd of approximately 75 people were present for the ceremony, which was held in Classroom Building West.

Dena Weber, Program Director of Adult Education, gave the welcome before introducing Aimee Onyett, who was the guest speaker for this year's ceremony.

Onyett was chosen to speak to the graduates for her impressive educational achievements and ambitions. After dropping out of high school due to various circumstances, Onyett earned her GED in 1997 from Frontier Community College. She ultimately decided to return for her Associate's Degree, completing the Nursing Program at FCC in 2011. Onyett has since earned a Bachelor's Degree in Nursing and will graduate in the fall with a Master of Science and Nursing Degree from Grand Canyon University.

Looking back on her path to success, Onyett has come a very long way. "If you set your mind to something, you can accomplish it no matter the circumstances in life," she said. Her story was inspiring to those who will soon be entering the workforce or returning to school for higher education.




Bruinsma Presents "Best Educational Session" at Cleveland Conference

The event brings in a diverse group of users and institutions to introduce successful practices and new ideas through roundtable discussions and group sessions.
