Electrical Distribution Systems Graduates Find Employment with the City of Fairfield Utility

Frontier Community College's (FCC) Electrical Distribution Systems graduates Tyler Lashbrook and Ryan Barrett have been hired as apprentice linemen for the Electric Distribution Department with the City of Fairfield. They are the first EDS graduates to be hired by the City and began their duties August 9. Lead Person for the department, Ed Garrett, noted that there were 12 applicants for the two positions. Lashbrook and Barrett began the interview process in April with a second interview in July. The men will spend the next three years completing on-the-job training and attending IBEW Apprentice Lineman classes once a month in West Frankfort before becoming a journey lineman.

Lashbrook graduated in May 2011 with Dean's Honors maintaining a 3.74-3.5 GPA. Following graduation, Lashbrook began working for Pike Engineering and was stationed in Lafayette, Indiana. In this position, he built transmission lines. More recently, Lashbrook

has been working for Brownstown Electric Supply in Fairfield.

Barrett is a May 2012 graduate and was a recipient of the Dean's Scholarship. He was awarded the Outstanding Student Award for the Electrical Distribution Systems Program and achieved the CEO Honors by maintaining a 3.9-4.0 grade point average. Barrett has been working for Reliable Oil Field Services while waiting for an opportunity to open.

The Electrical Distribution Systems program is a one-year certificate (fall and spring semesters). The program prepares individuals to build, repair, and maintain electrical distribution systems overhead and underground, use safe practices, first aid, and perform pole top rescue.

Retention Update

Orientation was reformatted from an 8-hour session to a 4-hour session. Students experienced an engaging, interactive encounter with campus through Student Services 101, LRC Scavenger Hunt, Campus Scavenger Hunt, Club Exploration, Meet the Faculty, and Commit to Complete activities. Four orientation sections were held compared to one last year. 98 students attended compared to 53 last fall. Feedback from student evaluations indicated that students found the presentation of content this year more useful than in the previous format.

back lunch - served approximately 115 students and faculty Retention & Career Services to the Rescue - Alyssa and Ashlee began going around to all classes discussed the various services offered to help students achieve their goals. All classes will be visited prior to midterm of the fall semester.

Pathways to Success is a course for first-time FCC students. 75 first-time FCC students are enrolled between six sections, with the exception of EDS students and students that successfully transferred credits from another institution. Spannagel and staff have designed tools to assess the achievement of learning outcomes, and will have a better understanding of the success of this initiative at FCC by December.

Athlete performance in their coursework is being closely monitored and tracked to determine eligibility.
