

If you are ever in need of assistance or simply want to learn more, be sure to visit our campus or give us a call. At Frontier Community College, we strive to be your college of choice!



AVERAGE CLASS SIZE












Who says you can't focus on your major before you transfer?

Six reasons to join a CTE program at FCC:

Hands-on education - Our CTE programs equip students with real-world knowledge and experience for a smooth transition into a career. Our Workforce Development Center spans 38,000 square feet, providing plenty of space for training. Here, you can find Phlebotomy students collecting blood samples and Automotive Technology students performing diagnostic training in a state-of-the-art lab.

Qualified educators - Learn from instructors with many years of experience and expertise in their field. Just like you, our instructors are always learning to ensure the technology of today is incorporated into the classroom.

Form close bonds - When you enroll in a CTE program, you'll spend the next one or two years with your classmates. Your class will learn together, grow together, and ultimately enter the workforce together!

Climb to new heights.

The Electrical Distribution Systems Program, nicknamed "EDS," is a one-year certificate. Unique to the Southern Illinois region, students in this program learn to build, repair, and maintain overhead and underground electrical distribution systems. Students will also master the skills of pole climbing, cross arm construction, hurt man rescue, and transformer installation. This program is a great first step in pursuing a lineman career.

Hands-on training is a daily routine in the EDS Program. In addition to classroom lecture, students spend nearly every day behind our Workforce Development Center, where fifteen 40 ft. electrical poles stand. By the end of their time in the program, students are ready and eager to transition from the classroom to a career.







UNIQUE PROGRAM FEATURES

Flagger certification - Flaggers place traffic cones and use signs or signals to communicate with motorists. This is very useful in seeking construction or lineman work.


Spray Applicator Licensure - With this license, individuals are certified in accordance with the EPA and state laws to apply restricted use pesticides (RUPs) on the job.

Commercial Driver's License (CDL) - Having a CDL when starting a career provides a competitive edge. Students will earn their CDL before completing the EDS program, allowing them to drive a bucket truck on the job.

Long weekends - Classes for the EDS program meet only three days each week, allowing students to maintain a job and manage other responsibilities.
