# Music Department gets new saxophone

The Olney Central College Foundation recently provided funding for the OCC Music Department to purchase a new Yanagisawa baritone saxophone with a low A.

Director of Bands Suzanne Downes said the baritone saxophone is a welcome addition to the department and will complement the other instruments it has acquired in recent years with assistance from both the Foundation and the college. She noted this particular instrument came highly recommended.

Downes said the baritone saxophone is needed for OCC's ensembles to perform college-level literature. OCC's Concert Band and Jazz Ensemble as well as the Community Band will benefit from the purchase.

"The baritone saxophone fills out the bottom sounds and gives the gut punch needed in the jazz band setting," she added.

# OCC hosts Transition Expo for area high school students

Students from 12 area high schools recently attended a Transition Expo at Olney Central College.

OCC Learning Skills Center Director Donita Kaare said the event focused on helping sophomores, juniors and seniors with disabilities transition from high school to college.

About 150 students and staff attended the program, which provided information on a variety of topics ranging from how to file for financial aid to the skills necessary for postsecondary education or to obtain a job.

Guest speaker Brent McGuire, a former police officer specializing in cyber security, discussed appropriate use of social media and steps students can take to protect themselves online.

Prior to the program, students completed a career assessment. The

expo featured a career fair, which gave them the opportunity to explore a number of fields.

"The students visited the different booths and had a chance to ask questions to help them determine what career they might want to go into," Kaare said. "They learned about the salary they could make and the training they would need."

Response from the students was overwhelmingly positive Kaare said.

"We got the evaluations back and they had comments like, 'This was the best day ever."

Students also toured OCC and enjoyed lunch in the Student Union.

The event was sponsored by the Southeastern Illinois Transition Planning Council, which includes representatives from the Department of Rehabilitation Services, ARC Community Support Systems, Southeastern Special Education and OCC.

GED test preparation classes will meet from 5 to 9 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays. The classes include a general review of test subjects and the books are free. Eight-week daytime classes begin March 11 and include math, reading, science, social studies, English and the Constitution.

OCC is encouraging those who haven't completed their GEDs to do so before changes are made to the test in 2014. Students, who haven't completed all subject areas by then will have to start over and pay for the test a second time.


Roosevelt. She finds a new home and family in billionaire Oliver Warbucks, his personal secretary Grace Farrell, and a lovable mutt named Sandy.

If you have questions, stop by the Financial Aid Office.





When the safety of students and staff is threatened due to inclement weather or other emergencies, OCC will be closed or classes canceled or delayed.

Administration will attempt to notify media outlets prior to the 6 a.m. news on the day of the closing.

Don't assume that if the elementary and high schools close, OCC will be closed as well. If no announcement is made, classes will meet as usual.

Closure of day classes does not necessarily mean that evening classes will be canceled.

# OCC emergency alerts

Illinois Eastern Community Colleges has contracted with e2Campus to provide alert notification services.

The system will notify students and employees of campus emergencies and closures by e-mail and/or cell phone text message. Log onto Entrata and click on the alerts link to activate an account.

IECC Alerts is an opt-in service. While there is no direct cost for signing up for the service, you may be charged a text message fee by your cell phone provider.

Please check your cell phone plan to understand the costs you may incur

using the service.

The system will be used to send text messages related



to campus emergencies, weatherrelated closures, test messages and notifications when accounts are about to expire.
