IECC ADULT EDUCATION PROGRAM RECEIVES \$327,000 GRANT

The IECC Adult Education Program, housed at Frontier Community College, has received a \$327K grant allocation from the Illinois Community College Board. This is a \$25K increase in funding over last year. The funds are designated for Adult Education and Literacy within the IECC District. Through the grant, the Adult Education Program can continue to reach out to the community and assist adults to achieve their High School Equivalency and become college and career ready.

Individuals within the community who are atleast 17 years of age, without a high school diploma and not currently enrolled in school can utilize the Adult Education services. IECC Adult Education and Literacy program offers Adult Basic Education (ABE) and Adult Secondary Education (ASE) courses to assist students with reading, writing and math skills. The program also offers classes to prepare students to earn their high school equivalency through the GED® test. The program also provides college and career readiness classes to prepare students for postsecondary education and workforce readiness. The grant also funds English as a second language (ESL) classes at select locations in the district for community members whose native language is not English and to also introduce students to U.S. culture.

CAMPUS CONTINUES TO REOPEN



Thanks to new safety procedures and advanced cleaning techniques, Frontier Community College has been able to welcome students back on campus for face-to-face instruction. This has been made possible by classroom remodeling, completed thanks to grant money received by the college to assist with COVID-19-related expenses, and by requiring masks to be worn inside campus buildings at all times.

With the returning of students to campus, FCC is excited to announce that it will be opening its facilities to the public starting September 14th. This includes Frontier Perks, the Bobcat Den, and other public facilities. Due to instructional use, Bob Boyle's Hall will continue to not be available

for rental during the week, but can be rented during the weekend, subject to availability.
