- **Corporations:** employees driving company vehicles and other key personnel.
- **General Public:** concerned citizens who want to improve their driving safety.

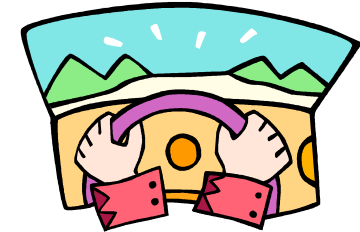
