

STUDENT INFORMATION CHECK SHEET

1. Complete the Student Information Form

New students or returning students should complete a Student Information Form and submit it to the Student Services Office or apply online at www.iecc.edu.

2. Request Transcripts/GED Scores

New students should have an official copy of their high school transcript or GED scores sent to the Records Office. Official transcripts from any other college(s) attended must also be sent to the Records Office.

3. Apply for Financial Aid

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) should be submitted electronically at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Students applying for scholarships or veteran's benefits should speak with a financial aid representative in the Financial Aid Office.

4. Placement Testing

Testing may be required of all new students and should be completed prior to registering for classes. Contact your college for guidelines concerning placement tests.

5. Register for Classes

New students should contact the college for an advisement and registration appointment. The current schedule of classes is available at www.iecc.edu. You are required to show a photo-id upon registration.

6. Pay Tuition and Fees

Tuition and fees may be paid in person at the Business Office, mailed, or online using Entrata. VISA and MasterCard are accepted.

7. Books

Students may purchase new and used books in the college bookstore or online.

8. Degree Evaluation

Students should run a Degree Evaluation every semester via their Entrata account and consult their advisor.

9. MyCreditsTransfer (formerly u.select Illinois)

Transfer students can use the MyCreditsTransfer request import online tool to determine how your IECC courses transfer to another college or university.

ONLINE DEGREES

The approval for distance delivery allows IECC to offer online courses which lead to the award of a two-year degree. IECC is accredited to offer Associate in Science and Arts Transfer Degree and Associate in Science Transfer Degree.

In addition, IECC has online registration, bookstores, library services, and technical assistance available to all students who enroll in online classes.

Online classes allow students the convenience of taking classes that fit into their schedules. The online classes follow the same timeline of traditional class semester offerings and typically run over a 16-week period. During the summer semester, online classes follow the 8-week schedule.

ILLINOIS EASTERN COMMUNITY COLLEGES

All four Illinois Eastern Community Colleges (IECC) offer excellent transfer programs for students who wish to continue their education at a four-year college or university. Students who plan to transfer usually enroll in the Associate in Science Associate and Arts, Associate in Science, or Associate in Arts degree programs. After successfully completing one of the Associate degrees, students can generally transfer to a four-year university with junior status. Spending your first two years at IECC is a smart move--in more ways than one.

Small class size and individual instruction are excellent reasons why you should spend your first two years with us. Statistics from area universities indicate that IECC transfer students do as well as, or better than, students who attend those universities their freshman and sophomore years. At Illinois Eastern Community Colleges, students can receive the preparation needed to transfer to a four-year college or university and successfully complete their Bachelor's degree. In addition, you can save a significant amount of money by completing your first two years of a four-year degree at IECC. Tuition is less than half of the cost of area universities and you can save additional money by living at home. Financial aid in the form of grants, loans, scholarships, and work study is available to those who qualify.

GENERAL EDUCATION CORE CURRICULUM

The General Education Core Curriculum (GECC) is the starting point for students pursuing an Associate transfer degree (60 or more semester credits) or a bachelor's degree (120 or more credits). These students must take a set of core courses considered an essential foundation for a well-rounded education. This core consists of 12 to 13 courses, or 37 to 41 credits. The iTransfer Web site will help you plan ahead to transfer successfully between participating IAI schools. The IAI codes can be explained further by an academic advisor or through the IAI website at www.iTransfer.org or iecc.edu.

MYCREDITSTRANSFER

MyCreditsTransfer (formerly u.select Illinois) is a statewide initiative designed to facilitate transfer within Illinois using the nationally available tool, Transferology. Within Transferology students can find out how courses transfer between institutions, how courses satisfy degree requirements and the different majors institutions offer.
