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




## Baseball camp to be held

# IECC nursing students attend NCLEX nursing review



On Tuesday, July 6, IECC's nursing students assembled in Wabash Valley College's Brubeck Arts Center Theatre for their Practical Nurse review.

The review was conducted by renowned lecturer Michele L. Deck, RN, BSN, M.Ed., LCCE, FACCE. Mrs. Deck is an author, educator and speaker who is known for her innovative teaching methods in the field of health care education and training. She has authored twelve books

on innovative ways to teach nursing and healthcare content. Mrs. Deck presented on the National Council Licensure Examination over the course of two days.

The NCLEX-RN® exam has one purpose: To determine if it's safe for you to begin practice as an entry-level nurse.

Mrs. Deck coached the students through 21 distinct modules that would prepare them for the exam.

Gill and Frasure accumulated 718 points (out of a possible 1,000), which was good for 16th place in the final standings for Team of the Year. This is an amazing accomplishment as there are over 400 teams and over 200 colleges competing on the Carhartt Bassmaster College Series.

Gill and Frasure managed to finish 31st out of the more than 260 teams competing that weekend.

In their inaugural season, the WVC Bass Warriors brought a lot of fish to the scales and stuck the spear in the ground as a force to be reckoned with for years to come on the collegiate bass series. The team finished 20th in the nation and with incoming freshmen recruits having high hopes for an even better "sophomore season."

# Lady Warriors sign top-scoring guard Jade Salters



The Lady Warriors signed one of the top scoring guards from the state of Ohio, Jade Salters.

Salters graduated from Warrensville Heights School in Cleveland. She had an accomplished high school career being named to Ohio's All State team and several player of the year awards. Jade was named Lake Erie Conference players of the year and also Northeast Lakes Division 3 player of the year. She also earned national honors and was named MaxPreps National Player of the Week.

During her high school career, Salters broke a school record scoring 59 points in a game. She posted the 1st quadruple double in school history scoring 31 points, 12 rebounds, 11 assist, and 10 steals.

"Jade is an elite level athlete. She has a nose for the ball and knows how to score. She is incredibly long and athletic. She also is a proven winner as she has helped take her high school team to back to back historic seasons. Jade is someone who fits our playing style and culture." said Coach Luke Scheidecker

The International Program's new space is coming along nicely. Main Hall 121 now has two new rooms inside of it, and the Operations & Maintenance team is working diligently toward its completion.

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
