




WVC softball to hold hitting camps

Wabash Valley College will host series of Softball Camps beginning on Sunday, Nov. 28 from 1 to 4 p.m. in Elberfeld, Indiana.




Free COVID-19 Testing

The Warriors finished the week competing in the Three Rivers Raider Classic. The Warriors will go up against #8 Three Rivers. The Lady Raiders return with their roster that went undefeated in the

regular season and made the Final Four in 2021. Finishing the week, the Warriors will face NJCAA D2 #20 So. Arkansas Tech.



COVID-19 cases remain low despite emergence of Delta variant



Wabash Valley College is continuing to see minimal amounts of COVID-19 infections on campus. This is due in large part to the mitigation measures enacted by the state and local governments and IECC district leadership.

With 44 percent of Wabash County residents having been vaccinated, it comes as no surprise that the county's positivity rate is sitting at a 1.2 percent. The state views the infection in the area as being suppressed.

Suppression is defined as having less than 10 cases per 7-day total and less than a 5 percent positivity rate.

Region 5 now boasts a 2.2 percent positivity rate.

As a continued means of mitigation and pursuant to the governor's mandate, WVC is offering free COVID-19 testing to students, faculty, and staff in the old Fitness Center on particular days and times.
