

DISSECTION GOES DIGITAL



SOLAR PANELS HELP TO POWER UP FCC

As of May 11th, the solar array at Frontier Community College has been fully operational. During the commissioning, Project Manager Michelle Knox, explained the system and how to access metrics. As of June 9th, since installation of the panels, the amount of energy they have generated is the equivalent of 83 trees being planted. In that same time frame, the carbon dioxide emissions that have been saved are approximately 10,919 lbs worth. FCC is thankful for all of the work put into making the installation possible, and look forward to seeing the impact the panels have in the short and long-term.
