

# REPORTING RELATIONSHIP/SEXUAL VIOLENCE

## WHAT IS CONSENT?

Consent is freely given agreement to sexual activity. Consent can be withdrawn at any time. Consent cannot be given when a person is unable to understand the nature of the activity or cannot consent-based on circumstances including but not limited to:

- Incapacitation due to the influence of drugs or alcohol;
- The person is asleep or unconscious;
- The person is not of legal age to consent;
- If the threat of force is used;
- The person is incapacitated due to a mental disability.

Consent must be given each time parties engage in sexual activity. Consent given on a prior occasion does not indicate future consent.

## WHAT IS SEXUAL MISCONDUCT?

Any physical act of a sexual nature, committed under duress or by force, or without the consent (a freely given, knowing agreement) of the individuals involved.
