MEDICAL EMERGENCY

General Guidelines for First Aid/Healthcare

- 1. Have the injured person care for him/herself whenever possible.
- 2. Avoid direct contact with blood or body fluids.
- 3. Wash hands thoroughly immediately after providing first aid.
- 4. Do not handle soiled materials. Notify the O & M Team Leader ext. 3750 to arrange for clean-up and decontamination of areas.
- 5. Obtain names and contact information of witnesses to injury or illness.

Minor Injury or Illness

- 1. Assess the situation and provide first aid/medical care as appropriate within your scope of training.
- 2. If professional medical attention is necessary, do not transfer the person.
- 3. If the injury is not life threatening but transportation to the hospital is warranted, you may give the individual the option of the following transportation methods:
 - a. Contact Emergency Medical Response Services (Call 911).
 - b. Contact a friend or family member to transport.
- 4. Notify your immediate supervisor as soon as feasible.
- 5. The staff member (s) directly involved shall complete an Incident Report form and submit to the President within 24 hours of the incident.

Serious Injury or Illness

- 1. Assess the situation and provide first aid/medical care as appropriate.
- 2. If you have any doubt about the type or extent of injury or illness, DO NOT MOVE THE PERSON.
- 3. Contact Emergency Medical Response Service (Call 911).
- 4. Contact Allied Health and initiate immediate first aid.
